


# INTRODUCTION

In this our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, we thought it appropriate to collect a listing of all publications of the Society for Growing Australian Plants (SGAP) and the Wildflower Society of Western Australia (WSWA). These publications could be either sponsored or supported by branches, regions, or the Federal body; or written by individuals or groups and supported by the above groups. This latter category includes publications by ASGAP Study Groups. The distinctions are quite difficult in the cases of peopl e who are prominent within SGAP but have had books published commercially, ie through a commercial publisher, but with no mention of SGAP/WSWA as publisher or sponsor. We have excluded all such books because our criterion has been that to be included, the publication must be initiated, sponsored or published by SGAP/WSWA. This is also partly for practical reasons, to prevent the list from becoming too unwieldy.

One category of publications which caused us some soul searching was the numerous project reports sponsored by the Wildflower Society of Western Australia, often in conjunction with volunteers of the Bushland Plant Survey Project. While it could be argued that these are more along the lines of a scientific survey rather than a more conventional "book", they are still work undertaken by an SGAP group aimed at promoting our flora and increasing knowledge of it. For this reason, we included them.

We have not listed most small or ephemeral pamphlets such as may be used to advertise activities of the Society although some of the "plant list for a particular area" type of publication can be less than 10 pages. However, there are some very early brochures, such as those published by the New South Wales Region in 1958, which we have included because of their historical significance.

We are keen to learn of any significant items we have missed and if necessary, will produce an addendum of such material in due course. It is noticeable that many of the publications written in the "early days" of the Society, Branches and Regions, are a guide for people on how to grow Australian plants and provide advice on e stablishing a "native" garden. It is also very noticeable that some of these have gone through many reprints and revisions, indicating that there is still a demand for this type of information, despite the explosion of books on Australian plants available through bookshops.

Bibliographies are commonly arranged alphabetically under authors and we again considered whether we should retain this format or list books under title. We also discussed keeping publications together by Region, or Branches, or categories, eg"how to establish native gardens", "plant lists for gardens in different regions", "local flora lists"etc, or to list them chronologically. No one way seemed best and in the end we opted for listing under five major categories, and within each, by author or the group/branch/region responsible. The use of author headings allows all their work to be kept together including those with minor name changes. These five major headings are:

- ► Books initiated/organised/sponsored by Bill Payne and the Publishing Section under the guidance of the Society for Growing Australian Plants, NSW Ltd.
- ▶Books published by SGAP Regions or Branches, or individuals sponsored by Regions or Branches
- ▶Books published by ASGAP Study Groups or individuals supported by Study Groups
- ▶Publications from ASGAP Biennial Conferences and APS Victoria F.J.C. Rogers Seminars
- ►Internet Publications

## ► Publications from ASGAP Biennial Conferences and APS Victoria F.J.C. Rogers Seminars

Although SGAP (as it was then) had held Annual Federal Conferences since September 1962, and Biennial Conferences since 1967 (see Walter (2007), p. 217 for a complete list), it wasn't until the Hobart Conference of December 1975 that a "symposium on Australian plants" was included. All subsequent Conferences have incorporated such a Seminar and many have adopted a theme to promote the Conference eg "Grow Local Plants" (Adelaide 1985), "The Brilliance of Australian Plants" (Ballarat 1995) and "Australian Plants in a Changing World" (Canberra 2001). While these are not strictly publications of ASGAP, being more along the lines of compilations of authors papers with minimal editing, they do represent an important resource of Australian plant knowledge. Unfortunately, relatively few are included in more than one or two Australian libraries (those known to be in libraries are marked with an asterisk\*) and ASGAP needs to address this situation before it is too late and ensure that copies are provided to at least the National Library in Canberra and major State Libraries. #### (b) APS Victoria F.J.C. Rogers Seminars

These are held every two years following the initial highly successful one in October 1996. They are organised by various groups within APS Victoria, often with the assistance of ASGAP Study Group members, and are strongly supported by APS Victoria. They commemorate Fred Rogers, well known Victorian plant grower and author who had been concerned that "SGAP should be more active in educating members about a specific group, or group of plants" (Raleigh (1996), cited in Walter (2007), p.205). Each Seminar deals with a specific genus or family of plants and since the first, a booklet has been produced, either specifically for the group under discussion and/or containing the papers presented at the Seminar. Garden and bush visits are always included in the Seminar programme, and often plant and seed sales. The Seminars are very popular and regularly attract visitors from interstate but once again, most of the earlier ones are not held in libraries and again, ASGAP needs to pursue this matter actively, as with the Federal Conference Seminar Papers.
